

#### CHIEF SHONKA VISITS RED HORSE DURING KATRINA RECOVERY

--Bay Saint Louis, Mississippi-The highest ranking NCO in the Florida Air National Guard, State Command Chief Master Sergeant Susan Shonka, was with the 202<sup>nd</sup> RED HORSE Squadron in late September; to observe hurricane recovery operations in Bay Saint Louis, Mississippi.

CMSGT Shonka said the devastation from Hurricane Katrina was unimaginable: "It's just unbelievable. You almost go numb after you keep seeing it. It's devastating-I can't imagine what I would do in my situation if it were happing to me. There are just no words to describe it. You can't go back and tell someone who hasn't been here how bad it is."

RED HORSE established a forward command post-Camp Haywood-at the Bay-Waveland Middle School, to house 500 Soldiers and Airmen assisting in Hurricane Katrina relief missions.

SMSGT Jeff Lindsey said after removing debris from local schools, RED HORSE initiated leveling and clearing operations to emplace thirty portable classrooms, "We cleared all this land, prepared it, and now we're putting down a base course six inches thick. We'll compact it and be ready for portables."

CMSGT Shonka observed RED HORSE airmen in action during her field visit, and was impressed: "What the RED HORSE folks are doing is just phenomenal. They're out there in 90+ heat, working, and doing whatever the community is needing. It's important to get these kids back in school, give them something to do while all this is going on, give them something steady and stable."

The Chief also attended a RED HORSE Supervisor's meeting, which she said was somewhat unconventional, "It was a different twist-they had the enlisted Soldiers and Airmen give the reports, and that was a nice twist. The facility here is great, and it's just something to see."

Camp Haywood was named in honor of SSGT Haywood Brown, a 202<sup>nd</sup> Airman who died of cancer on 9 September 2005. Housing 500 Soldiers and Airmen, the base comes complete with air conditioned tents, shower, shave, restroom facilities, as well as an outdoor gym orchestrated by MSGT Ricky Dumm. The gym has fifteen hundred pounds of weightlifting equipment. Another new feature-an M.W.R. (morale, welfare and recreation) tent named "Charlie's Café." The M.W.R. tent sports a television, cold sodas, hot coffee, and snacks.

Commanded by Colonel Jack Paschal, the 202<sup>nd</sup> RED HORSE Squadron has participated in hurricane recovery operations for twenty years, in addition to wartime assignments in Iraq, Afghanistan, Africa and Qatar.
